

## Cedarwood Chronicle

We wanted to reach out to our family members to update you on visitation at Cedarwood. As you know we had suspended our family related to a positive cases of COVID-19 in our facility. After repeat testing and confirming we have no active cases of COVID-19, consulting with our Public Health Department and our Medical Director we have decided we can safely begin to allow some visitation again.

We want to begin with only outdoor visits initially while we watch what happens to the positivity rate in our community with school starting up. We have decided to open up our visitation guidelines by not setting specific days or times for visits. What we plan to do instead is the following:

Closed window visits can be held at any time, without an appointment, visitors do not have to be screened for closed window visits. Please feel free to come for a closed window visit at any time. If you need staff to assist your loved one by taking a phone to them so they can visit on the phone while you stand outside, we will be happy to do that.

Open window visits or courtyard visits Monday-Friday from 9:00am-4:30 **must** be scheduled *in advance* of your visit. Please call Cedarwood business office at least 4 hours in advance, to schedule a visit between business hours. We must have additional staff available to screen visitors and to monitor visits for appropriate distancing and mask use for open window visits. Calling in advance will allow us to assign a staff person to make it possible for you to visit. We are only allowing open window visits to be held in our chapel as they *must* be supervised by staff. Please do NOT come for an open window visit from your loved ones apartment.

For open window visits or courtyard visits on Weekends or after 4:30 on weekdays we need to have family call 1-2 days in advance so we can determine *if* we can staff the time you hope to visit. We ask that you call the Cedarwood office . . . Monday-Friday 9:00-4:30 to discuss the possibility of scheduling a visit.

We know that this has been an extremely difficult time for our residents and our families and our goal is to bring our families and residents together while we are able to do so. I do anticipate that when influenza season begins, we will not be able to safely allow family to visit. For this reason I encourage you to call and schedule time(s) to visit with your loved ones while we are still able to do so. While we cannot guarantee that we can always schedule a visit on the day & time you are hoping for, we will certainly make every effort to do so.

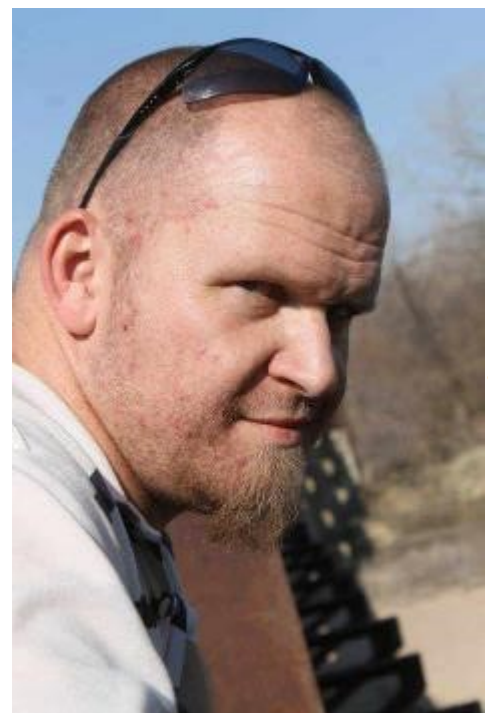
